NEW PROCUREMENT POLICY FOR MSEs AND ANCILLARY UNITS

(A) Transaction Cost

(i) For MSE's

To reduce transaction cost of doing business, Micro and Small Enterprises shall be facilitated by,

- Providing them tender sets free of cost
- Exempting MSEs from payment of earnest money.

(ii) For Ancillary

Exemption from Tender-Form-Fee, Earnest Money Deposit & Security Deposit.

(B) (I) Purchase Preference: Off take (A) cases

(a) For MSE's

If L-1 Tenderer is a MSE Unit, 100% will be booked to L-1 tenderer (MSE) limited to its capacity.

(b) For Ancillary

(i) If L-1 tenderer is an Ancillary Unit and there is only one Ancillary Unit for that particular item, 100 % should be booked on them limited up to their capacity.

(ii) If there are more than one Ancillary Unit and one of the ancillary units have quoted the lowest prices then the distribution will be done on the basis of number of participating ancillary units and their prices status in the tender in the following manner, subject to acceptance of L-1 (landed) price other than L-1 Ancillary unit.

- a. If there are 2 Ancillary Units then the distribution will be 60 % for lowest ancillary unit and remaining 40 % to the other ancillary unit.
- b. If there are 3 ancillary units participating in the tender the distribution will be in proportion of 50 %, 30 % and 20 % respectively in order of price status of the ancillary units.
- c. In case there are 4 ancillary units, the distribution will be 40 %, 30 %, 20 % and 10 % respectively in order of price status of the ancillary units.

FLOW CHART of above Situation is enclosed at Pg C/6 to 8.

(B) (II) Purchase Preference: Off take (B) cases, where L-1 Tenderer is not a MSE Unit and there are other ancillary units only for ancillarised items.

Situation – 1 : If L-1 tenderer is a non-ancillary unit and there is one ancillary unit available for that item, 50 % of the requirement limiting to the capacity of the ancillary unit will be offered to ancillary unit subject to their acceptance of lowest rates (landed) and the remaining quantities will be booked to the non-ancillary L-1 tenderer. Failing in acceptance of counter offer of lowest price by ancillary units, the entire 100 % requirement will be booked to original L-1 non-ancillary tenderer.

Situation – 2 : In case there are more than one ancillary units and the lowest rate has been received from a non-ancillary firm then 50 % of the requirement will be booked in favour of non-ancillary lowest tenderer and the remaining 50 % will be distributed amongst the ancillary units in order of their price status as have been explained before at B(I) b(ii) subject to their acceptance of counter offer for lowest rates (landed).

FLOW CHART of above Situation is enclosed at Pg C/9 & 10.

(B) (III) Purchase Preference: Off take (B) cases, where L-1 Tenderer is not a MSE Unit for non ancillarised items.

Situation – 1 : If L-1 tenderer is a Non-MSE unit and there is one MSE unit who quoted price within price band of L1 + 15% , 20% of the requirement will be given to MSE, limiting to their capacity, subject to their acceptance of lowest rates. Remaining 80% will be booked to Non-MSE L-1 tenderer. Distribution will be as under:

- 20% of the requirement to MSE
- 80% of the requirement to L-1 tenderer (Non MSE)

Situation – 2 : If L-1 tenderer is a Non-MSE unit and there are more than one MSE unit who quoted price within price band of L1 + 15% , 20% of the requirement will be distributed amongst MSEs, limiting to their capacity ,subject to their acceptance of lowest rates. Remaining 80% will be booked to Non-MSE L-1 tenderer. Distribution will be as under:

- 20% of the requirement will be shared equally amongst MSEs
- 80% of the requirement to L-1 tenderer (Non MSE)

* All the above orders will be at L-1 quoted / negotiated (landed) price.

** Quoting Price of MSE should be within Price band of L1+15%.

*** Failing in acceptance of counter offer of lowest price by MSEs , the entire 100 % requirement will be booked to original L-1 Non-MSE tenderer.

NOTE: Ancillary unit can participate as MSE unit and will be facilitated as above, if the item tendered is non ancillarised.

(B) (IV) Purchase Preference: Off take (B) cases, where L-1 Tenderer is Non-MSE unit for ancillarised item and tender participants includes MSE and ancillary units.

Situation – 1 : If L-1 tenderer is a Non-MSE unit and there is one MSE unit quoted within (L-1+ 15%) and one ancillary unit, Counter offer will be as under.

- 20% of the requirement will be offered to MSE
- 40% of the requirement will be offered to Non-MSE L-1 tenderer (50% of rest 80%)
- 40 % of the requirement will be offered to ancillary (50 % of rest 80 %)

Situation – 2 : If L-1 tenderer is a Non-MSE unit and there is one MSE unit quoted within (L-1+ 15%) and one ancillary unit quoted with in (L1+15%) , Counter offer will be as under.

- 10 % of the requirement will be offered to MSE
- 40 % of the requirement will be offered to Non-MSE L-1 tenderer
- 50 % of the requirement will be offered to ancillary (10 % for quoting price within L1+15% + 50 % of 80 %)

Situation – 3 : If L-1 tenderer is a Non-MSE unit and there is no MSE unit quoted within (L-1+ 15%) and there is one ancillary unit, within (L-1 + 15 %), Counter offer will be as under.

- 40% of the requirement will be offered to Non-MSE L-1 tenderer (50% of rest 80%)
- 60 % of the requirement will be offered to ancillary (i.e 20 % to ancillary unit being MSE unit quoting within (L-1 + 15 %) and 40 % being ancillary unit.)

* All the above orders will be at L-1 quoted / negotiated (landed) price.

(B) (V) Purchase Preference: Off take (B) cases, where L-1 Tenderer is MSE unit and there is only one ancillary unit for ancillarised item

Situation – 1 : If L-1 tenderer is a MSE unit and one ancillary unit, Counter offer will be as under.

- 60 % of the requirement will be offered to MSE
- 40 % of the requirement will be offered to ancillary

Situation – 2 : If L-1 tenderer is a MSE unit and one ancillary unit quoted with in (L1+15%) , Counter offer will be as under.

- 50 % of the requirement will be offered to MSE
- 50 % of the requirement will be offered to ancillary unit

Situation – 3 : If L-1 tenderer is a MSE unit and one ancillary unit and one MSE quoted with in (L1+15%) , Counter offer will be as under.

- 50 % to L-1 MSE ((i.e 10 % to being MSE unit quoting within (L-1 + 15 %) and 40 % being L-1 unit.)
- 10 % of the requirement will be offered to MSE who quoted within price band of (L1+15%)
- 40 % of the requirement will be offered to ancillary unit (i.e. 50 % of 80 % requirement)

* All the above orders will be at L-1 quoted / negotiated (landed) price.

(C) Special Provisions for MSEs owned by SC or ST

Out of 20% of annual requirement from the MSEs, a sub-target of 4% (20% of 20%) will be earmarked for procurement from the MSEs owned by SC/ ST entrepreneurs

If L-1 tenderer is a Non-MSE unit and there are MSEs unit owned by SC & ST who quoted price within price band of L1 + 15% available for that item, the distribution will be as under.

(i) Depending upon the no. of MSEs quoting price within the price band a minimum of 4% shall be ensured for SC or ST owned MSEs.

Example: If L-1 tenderer is a Non MSE, and two MSEs (01 Gen & 01 SC or ST owned) quoting price within price band of L1+15%, 20% of the tendered item will be equally shared i.e. 10% each. In this case SC or ST owned MSE shall get 10% instead of 4%.

When the nos. of participating MSEs will increase the % distribution amongst MSEs will certainly decrease but a minimum of 4% shall be ensured for SC or ST owned MSEs.

* All the above orders will be at L-1 quoted / negotiated (landed) price.

** However, in the event of failure of such MSEs to participate in the tender process or meet the tender requirements and L-1 price, the 4% sub-target for procurement earmarked for MSEs owned by SC/ ST entrepreneurs will be met by other MSEs.

(D) List of items for which ancillarisation awarded to MSEs

There are 49 ancillarised items on which ancillary status was awarded by MCL. List of 49 ancillarised items is enclosed at Pg C/29 & 30. 49 ancillarised items, 12 items are common to List of 358 reserved items for MSEs.

Items are Bandage Cloth, M.S.Bolts & Nuts (upto ¾' size), Gauge Cloth, PVC Pipes (upto 110 mm), RCC Pipes (upto 1200 mm dia), Rivets of all types, Screws of all types including high tensile, Steel Furniture, Tubular Poles, Washers (all types), Wire Nails, Wooden Furniture.

(E) Reservation of specific items for procurement.

358 items have been reserved for exclusive purchase from MSEs. List of Items Reserved for purchase from Small Scale Industrial Units including Handicraft Sector is enclosed at Appendix of the Policy, refer Pg. C/20 to 28.

– MCL will continue to procure 358 items from MSEs.

(F) New Public Procurement Policy shall apply to Micro and Small Enterprises registered with District Industries Centres or Khadi and Village Industries Commission or Khadi and Village Industries Board or Coir Board or National Small Industries Corporation or Directorate of handicrafts and Handloom or any other body specified by Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises.

(G) Additional Points of Ancillary Policy which are in force:

(i) Quantity and Price for Trial Order :-

Provisional Ancillary units will be considered for procurement of 10% of total requirement on trial basis subject to their acceptance of L-1 rates received / negotiated against the tender.

(ii) Payment of regular and trial orders :-

For regular orders 100% payment within 21 days of receipt of material.

For trial orders 50% of the payment shall be released where performance reports of the trial samples are not received within 3 months. The balance 50% can be released on getting the performance report.

The performance period shall be considered as 50% of the warranty period and parties can be released fresh orders based on performance report.

(iii) Rate Contract :-

There will invariably be open tender for conclusion of rate contract for supply of various input items. Ancillary Units who participate in the open tender will be considered for rate contracts and the off take against the RCs in favour of Ancillary Units will be in the manner as mentioned under point (B)(I)(b)(ii) and (B)(II).

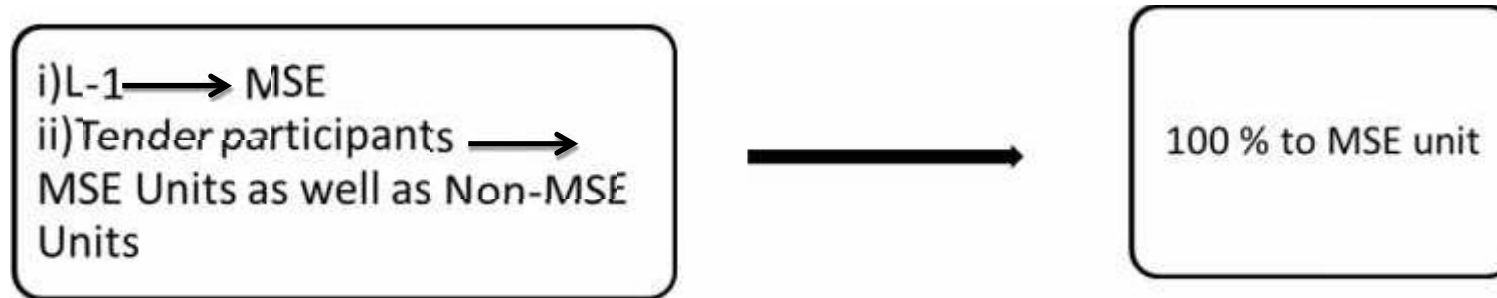
(iv) Method of fixing prices :-

MCL clarifies that any of the methods as given below would be accepted for fixation of prices for ancillarised items.

- Repeat orders
- Other subsidiary prices
- Tendering
- DGS & D rates
- Rate Contract

Choice of adoption of any of the above methods for fixing of prices lies with HOD (MM) for Hqrs. & Staff Officer (MM) in Areas.

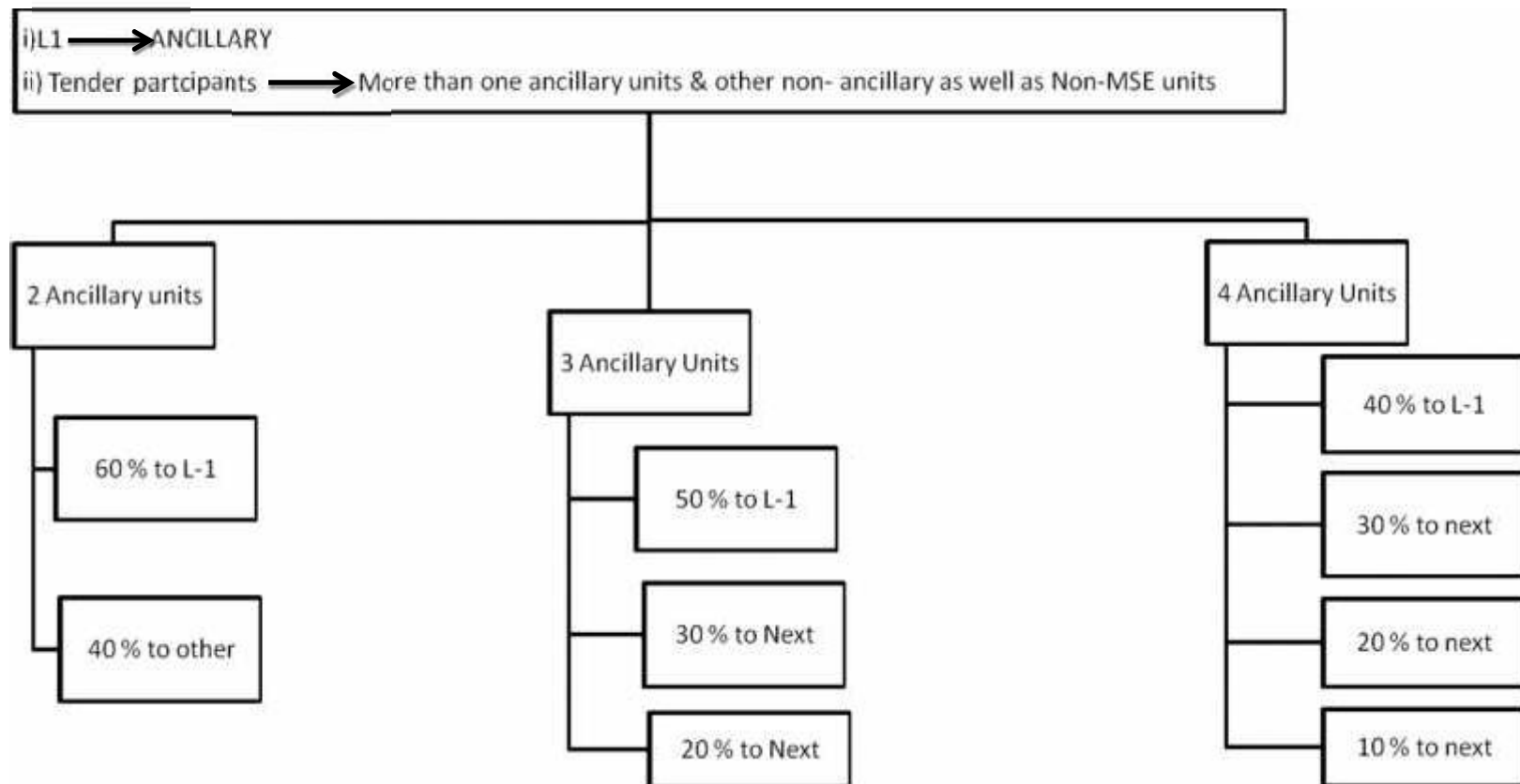

B (I) SITUATION – (b): i) For Ancillarised items Where L-1 is an Ancillary unit



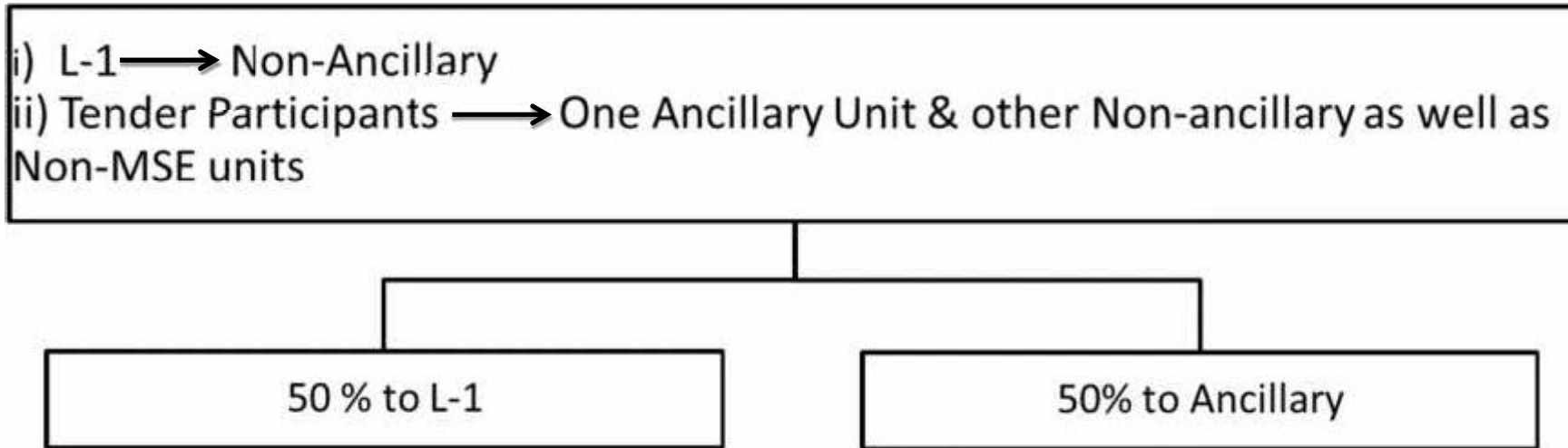
B (I) SITUATION – (b): ii) For Ancillarised items Where L-1 is an Ancillary unit

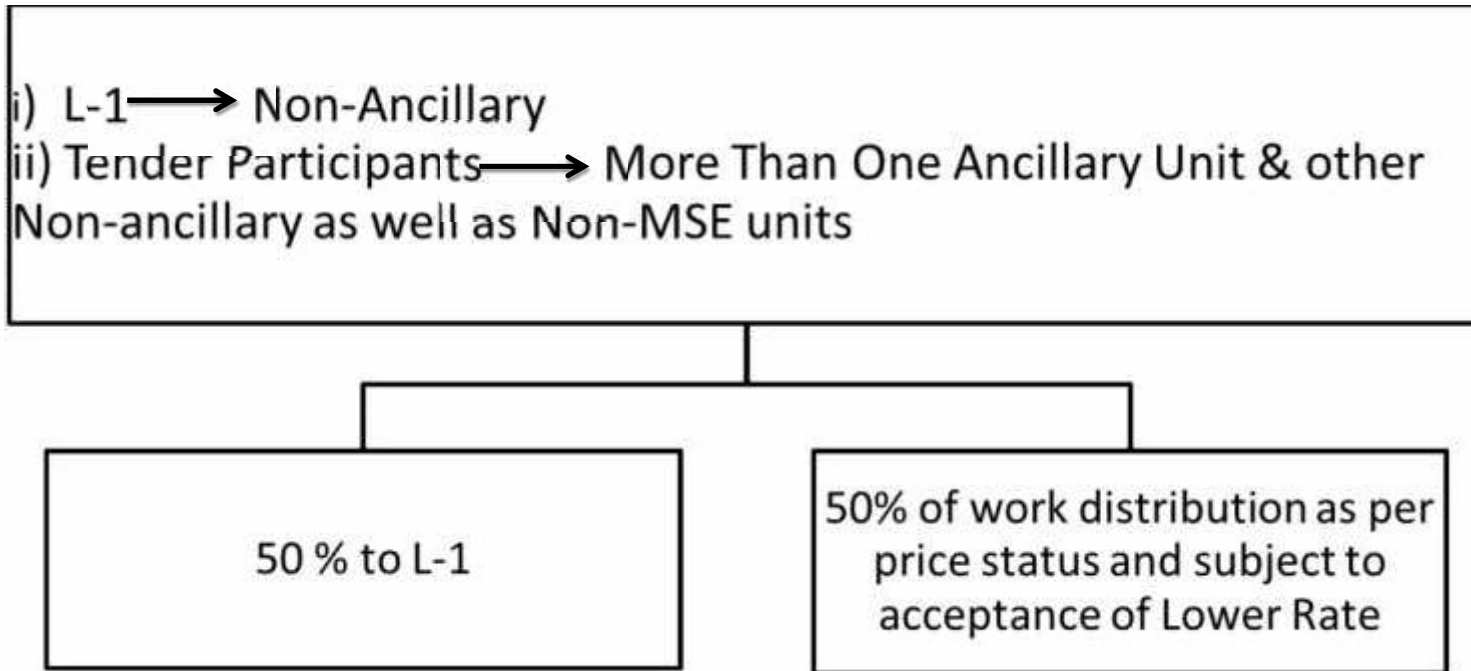
B (II) SITUATION – 1: Where L-1 is a Non –MSE unit for Ancillarised items

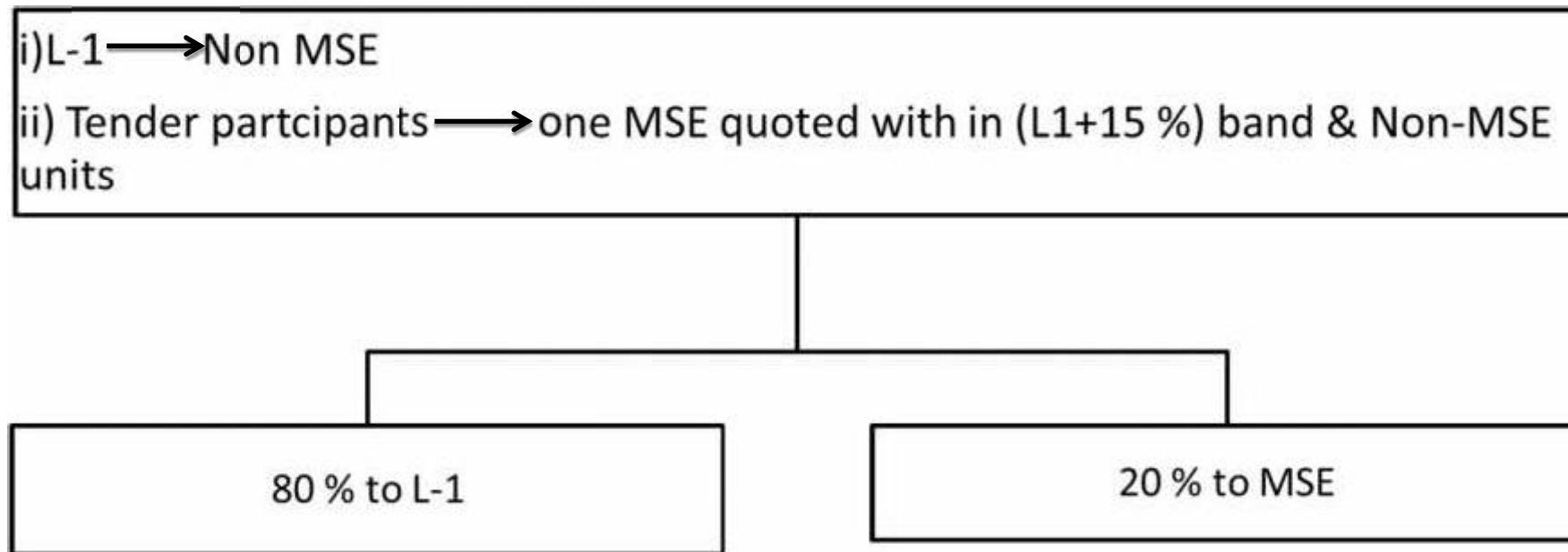
B (II) SITUATION – 2: Where L-1 is a Non MSE unit for Ancillarised items

- III. Quoting price by ancillary has no price band for counter offer

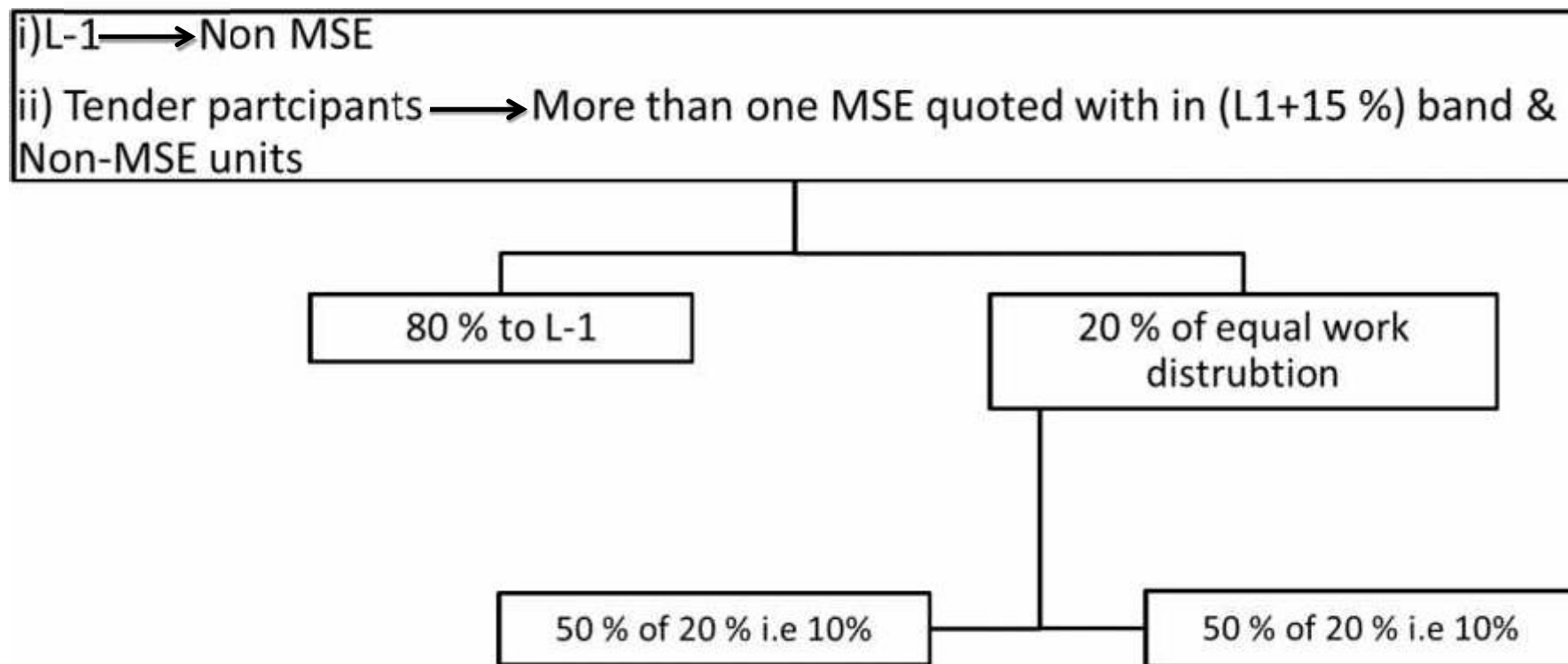
B (III) SITUATION – 1: Where L-1 is a Non MSE unit for non-ancillarised items

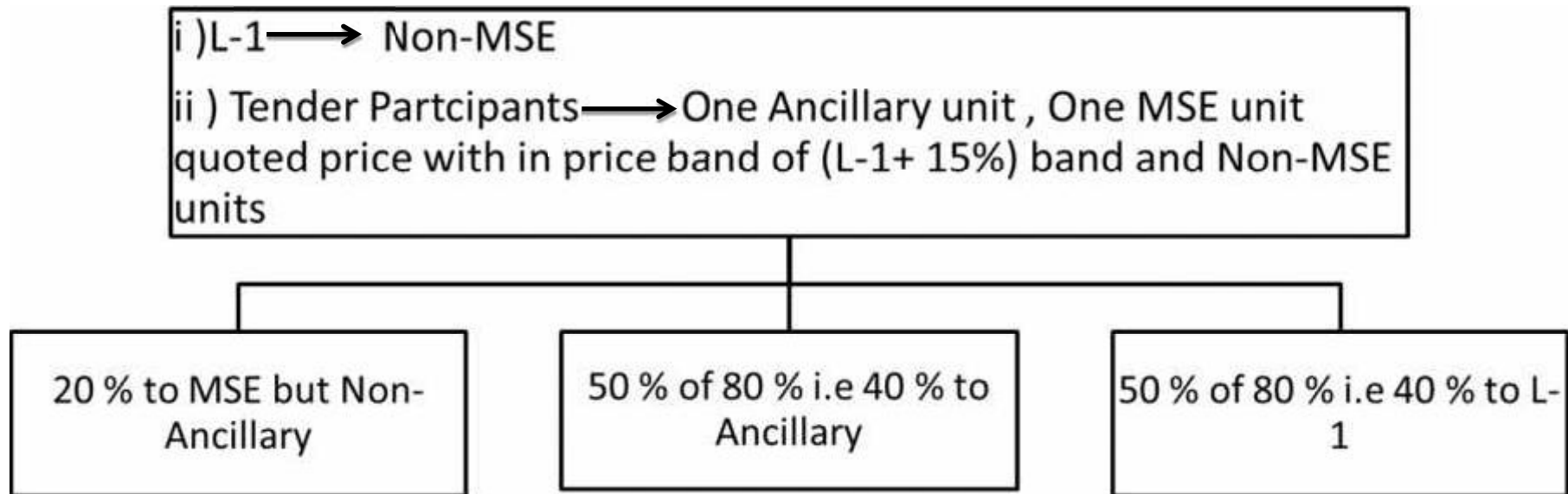
B (III) SITUATION – 2: Where L-1 is a Non MSE unit for non-Ancillarised items

- III. If more than two MSE units quoted with in (L-1 + 15 %) then there will be equal distribution subjected to acceptance of L-1 price

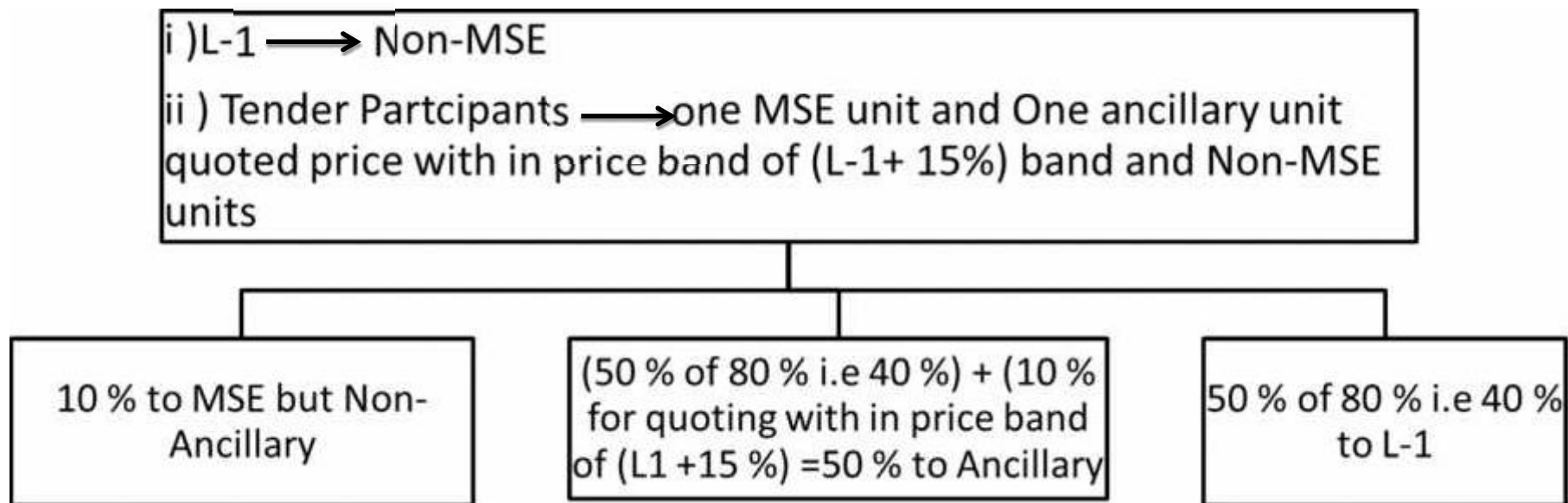
B (IV) SITUATION – 1: Where L-1 is a Non-MSE unit for ancillarised items

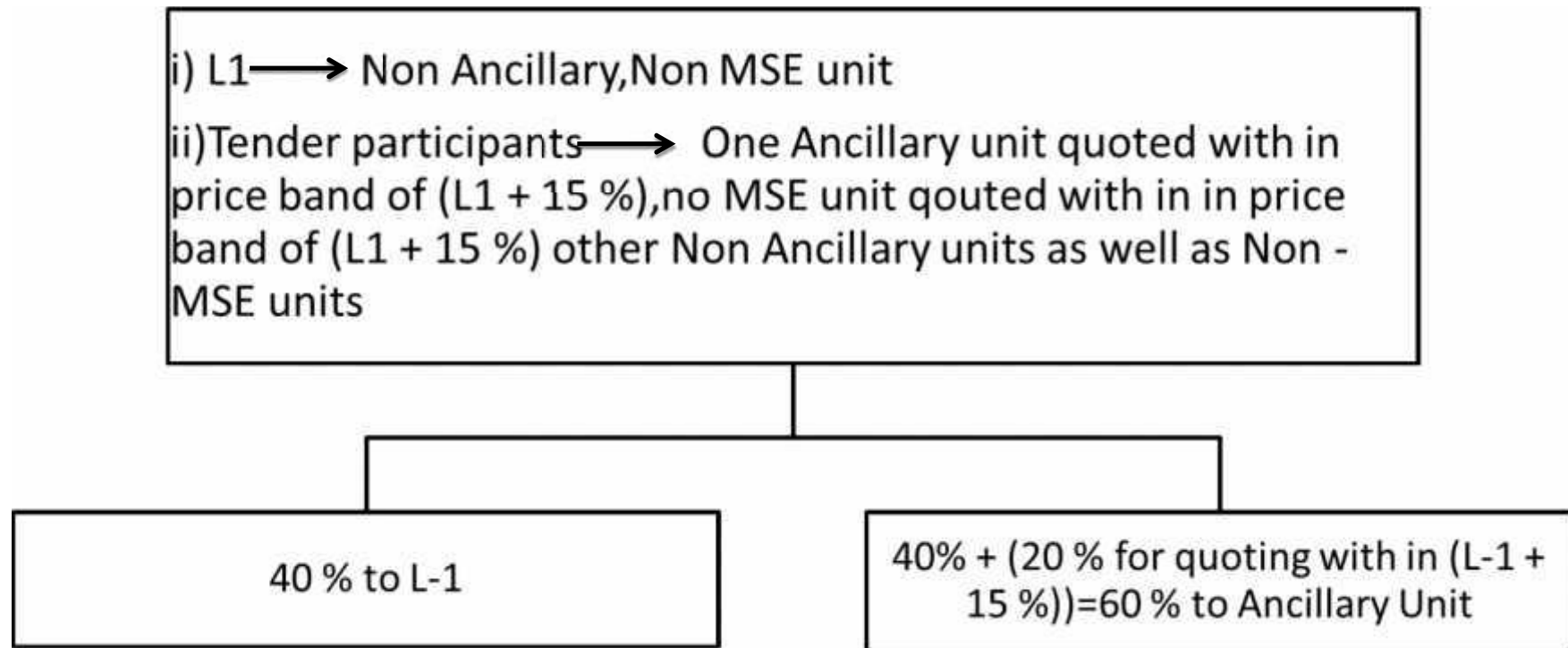
B (IV) SITUATION – 2: Where L-1 is a Non-MSE unit for ancillarised items

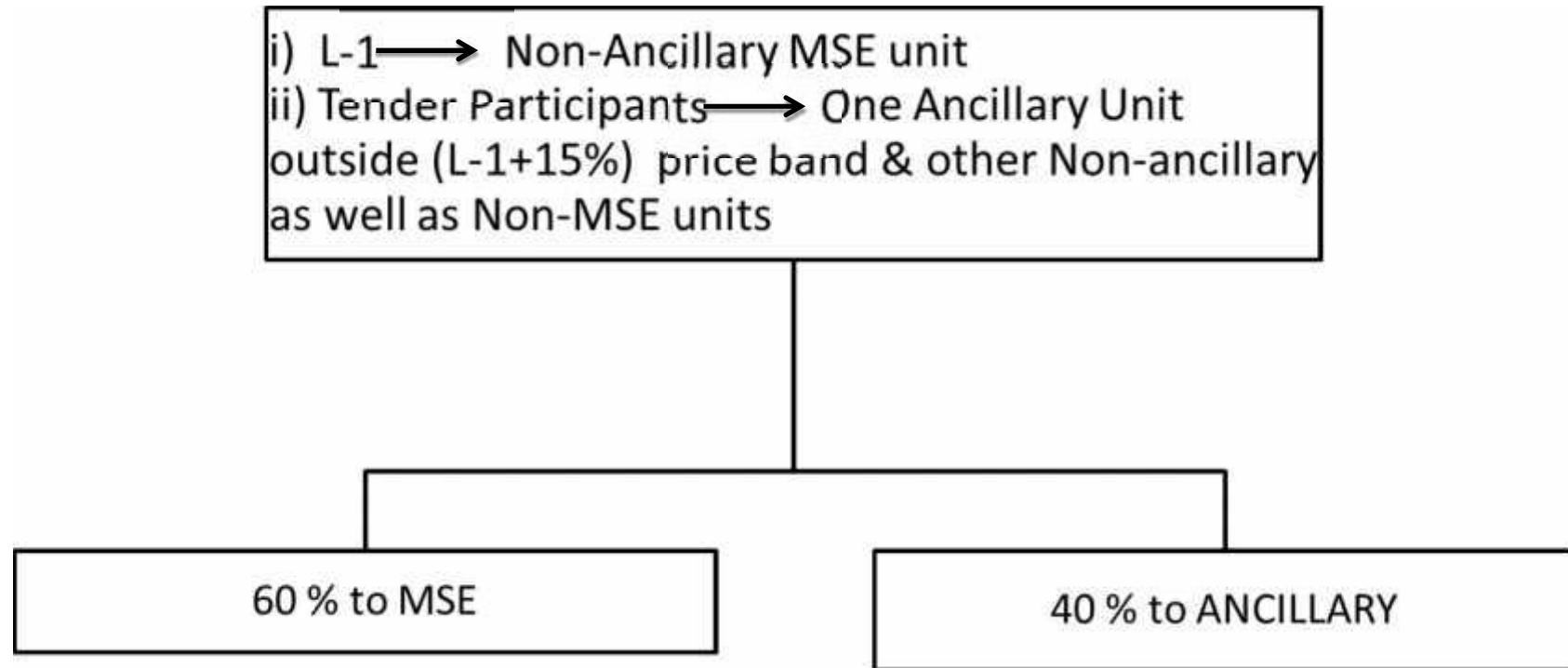
B (IV) SITUATION – 3: Where L-1 is a Non-MSE unit for ancillarised items

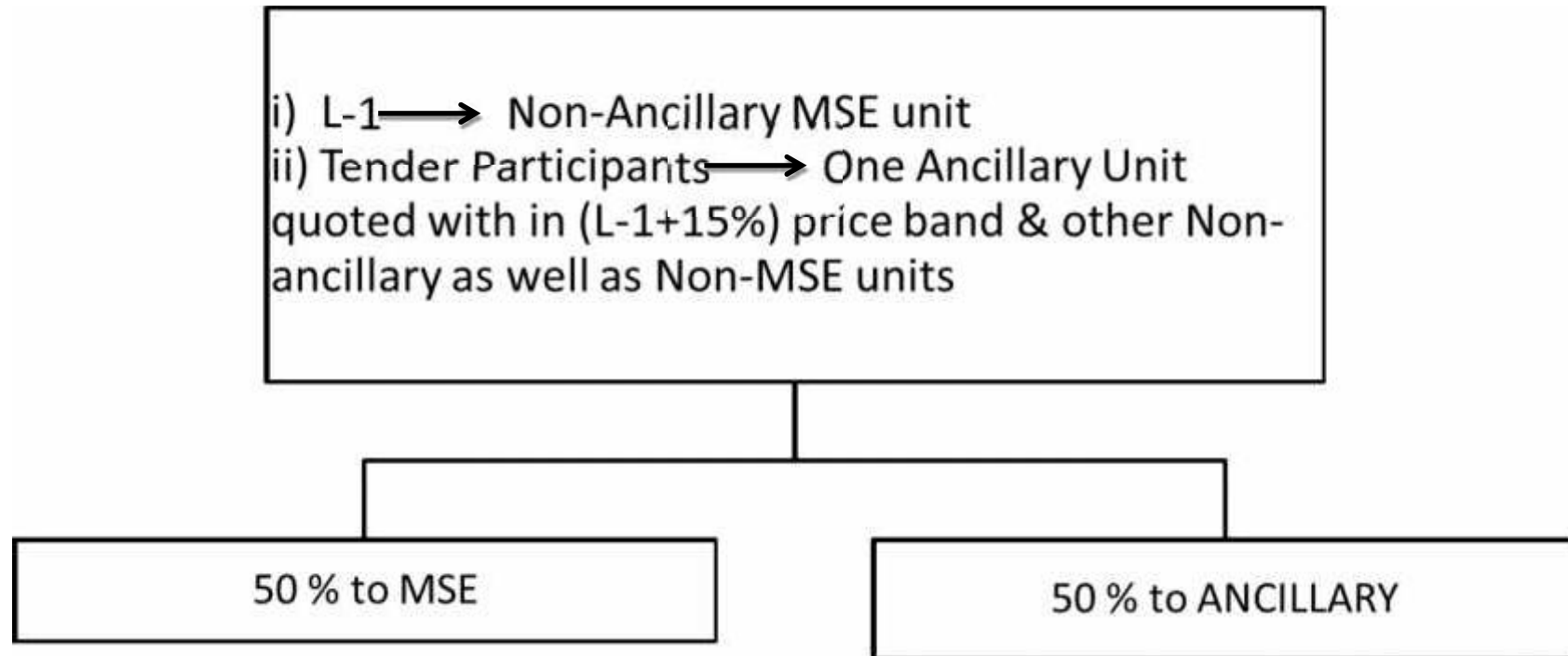
B (V) SITUATION – 1: Where L-1 is a MSE unit for ancillarised items

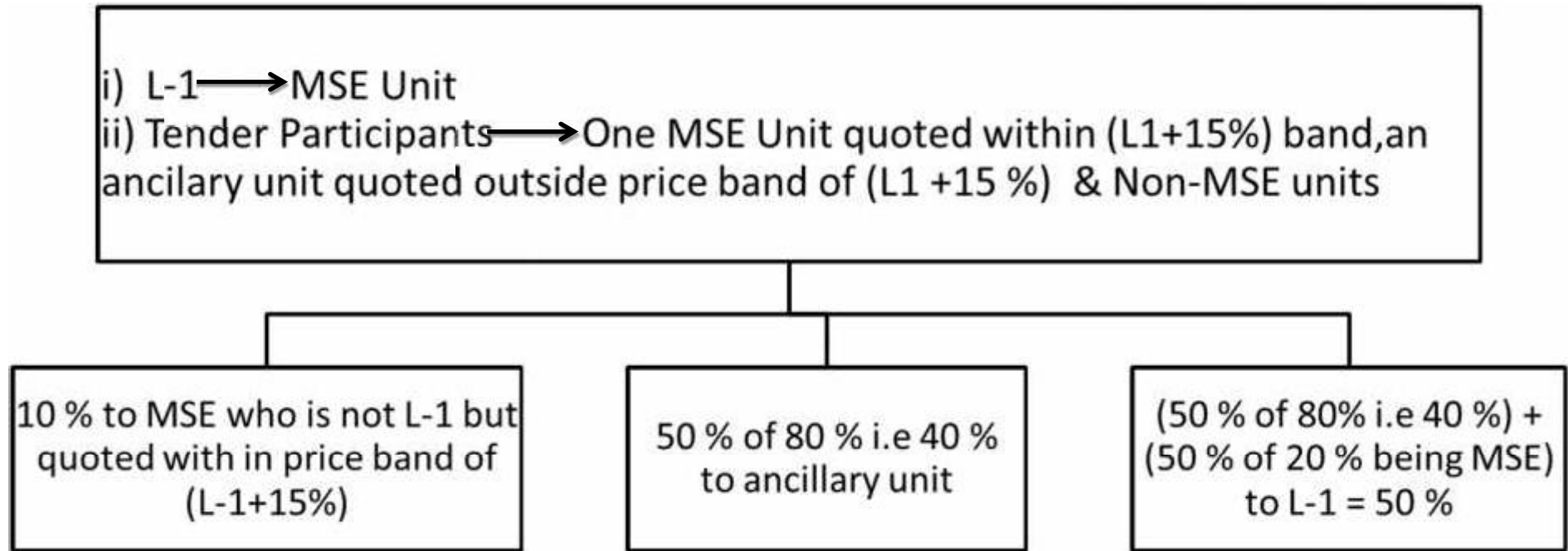
B (V) SITUATION – 2: Where L-1 is a MSE unit for ancillarised items

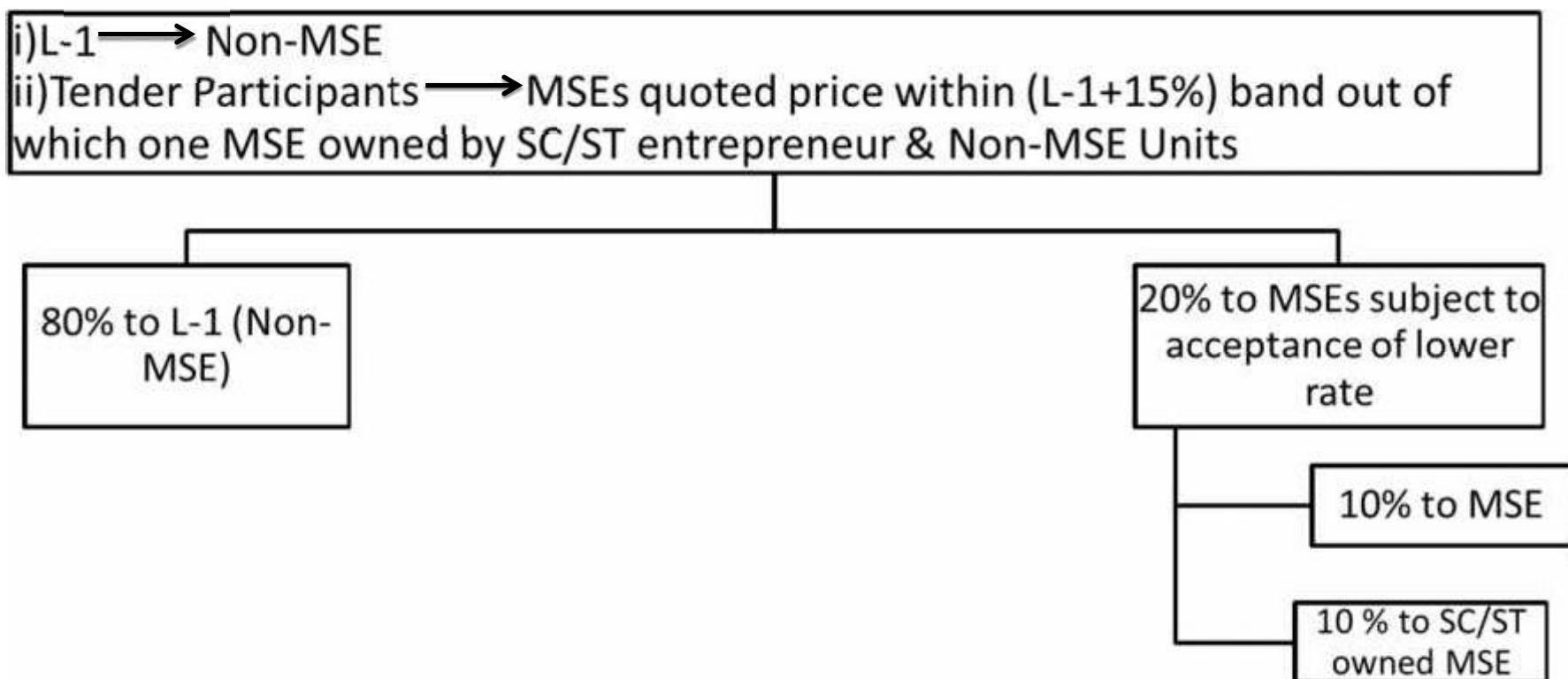
B (V) SITUATION – 3: Where L-1 is a MSE unit for ancillarised items

- III. However in the event of failure of such MSE's too participate in tender /meet tender requirements 4 % earmarked for procurement process owned by SC/ST entrepreneurs will be met by other MSE's
