

Held on assault charge, Maharathy fails to vote

Bhubaneswar: BJD candidate from Pipili assembly seat, Pradeep Maharathy, who was arrested on Monday on charges of assaulting a team of election commission officials during a raid at his farmhouse the previous night, could not vote on Tuesday as election rules do not allow convicts and undertrials to exercise their franchise.

Bhubaneswar disappoints again, registers low turnout

Bhubaneswar: In spite of campaigns on social media, the state capital maintained its tradition of recording a low voter turnout on Tuesday. Of the six Lok Sabha constituencies that voted in the third phase, the city recorded the lowest polling percentage — 50.46 — according to data gathered till 5 pm. The state average till that time was 61 per cent.

In 2014, the Lok Sabha constituency had recorded a polling percentage of 58 — the lowest in the state. Then, the average polling percentage in three of the seven assembly constituencies under it was 44.34. Since polling in the city was still on when the data came in, a marginal increase in the voter turnout is expected. "Still, the turnout is against the expectation of analysts, who predicted that it would be higher than in 2014."

"We are compiling booth-wise data. It is likely that the Bhubaneswar Lok Sabha seat will either touch last year's percentage or remain slightly below that," said a source at the CEO's office. Three of the Lok Sabha seats are in the city proper. They are Bhubaneswar-Central, Bhubaneswar-North, the other seats — Jagadev, Janti, Begunia and Khurda — usually record over 70 per cent turnout.

In Bhubaneswar-Central and Bhubaneswar-North, polling had not crossed 40 per cent till 5 pm. The Bhubaneswar-Ekama seat recorded 45.15 per cent polling while the Begunia seat recorded 63.20 per cent.

In the six seats that voted on Tuesday, there were around

7,000 first-time voters. Analysts were hopeful that the first-time voters would turn up in large numbers to exercise their franchise. Two former bureaucrats — BJP's Aparajita Sarangi and former Municipal police commissioner Arup Patnaik of BJD — are pitted against each other in the Lok

Sabha seat. The Bhubaneswar Lok Sabha segment has around 16 lakh voters, of which more than 2 lakh voters hail from the 236 sham pockets. Located mostly in the Bhubaneswar-North seat. This is significant as residents of these areas don't shy away from voting unlike their middle-class counterparts.

Ranjana Mohanty, coordinator of private body Odisha Election Watch, termed the voter turnout in Bhubaneswar as "unfortunate". "A study is needed to see why people are so indifferent to elections here. Elsewhere, polling has been impressive," he said.

haver Anubhav Mohanty in Kendrapada against Bijoyant Panda, who resigned from the party last year and joined BJP recently. The Congress has fielded lawyer-politician Dhananjay Nayak in the Kendrapada Lok Sabha seat.
