

KEONJHAR DMF FUND MISUSE CASE Govt again seeks more time to submit report

Keonjhar/Hatadihi, Nov 14: The state government has once again sought additional time to submit its report in the case concerning alleged large-scale irregularities, misappropriation, and misuse of funds from the District Mineral Foundation (DMF) in Keonjhar district.

The case-WP (C) PIL-26601/2024 was heard Wednesday by a two-judge bench of Chief Justice Harish Tandon and Justice Murahari Sri Raman of the Orissa High Court. The next hearing has been scheduled for December 10.

According to petitioner's counsel Prashant Kumar Satapathy, the state-level committee headed by the Chief Secretary is moving as per the direction of the high court has yet to submit its report. During the hearing, the government sought four more weeks for the third time, citing the need to review and compile reports received from various departments before submission.

Kendrapara cops attacked in Keonjhar, accused freed

Four personnel, including a woman constable, injured

Hatadihi/Keonjhar, Nov 14: A team of Kendrapara Sadar police officers was allegedly attacked by a group of nearly 60 men in Keonjhar district late Thursday night, with four personnel, including a woman constable, sustaining injuries. The mob reportedly freed a suspect accused of fraud from police custody and assaulted the officers before fleeing the scene.

According to police sources, Kendrapara Sadar police had arrested Jogendra Behera of Elkonia village in connection with a large-scale financial fraud. Behera was in custody produced at Nandipada police station and handed over to Kendrapara officers.

While the team was returning with the accused along the Sahapur-Jalasarpur route, the police vehicle, dragged the officers out, and thrashed

them, officials said. The attackers then freed the accused and escaped.

Following the incident, Kendrapara Sadar police inspector BB Sahana lodged a written complaint at Nandipada police station. A case (362/25) was registered and an accused identified as Saroj Nayak arrested near Solapata village. He is currently being questioned.

Under the supervision of Anandapada SDPO Prashant Behera, multiple police teams have been deployed to track down the remaining attackers. Nandipada IIC Dharmendra Shanti confirmed that five Kendrapara police personnel were part of the team, four of whom received injuries and were treated at the Shalamba Community Health Centre (CHC).

Minor rape victim cries cop inaction, moves SP

Dhenkanal, Nov 14: A 17-year-old tribal girl from the Kamakhyanagar police limits in Dhenkanal district Friday approached the Superintendent of Police (SP) alleging that the local police denied her to register her complaint of rape by a youth.

According to the girl, a local youth raped her in a forested area January 15 and later threatened to kill her if she reported the assault.

She delivered a baby girl October 25, but the child died shortly after birth, she said.

Following the child's death, the accused returned to the village November 5 and again issued threats, the girl stated in her complaint.

When she approached the Kamakhyanagar police to file a complaint, a local officer there allegedly refused to register her complaint. The officer also allegedly hinted that the matter could be 'managed' if the survivor paid a bribe.

With no way out, the survivor, with the help of social worker Sachin Behera, moved the SP office Friday and submitted a written complaint.

Acting on the complaint, Additional SP Suryamani Pradhan ordered Kamakhyanagar police to register a case under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) and to arrest the accused immediately. An investigation is in progress, it was learnt.

Man found dead in pond; kin cry planned murder

Parjang, Nov 14: Police Friday recovered the mutilated body of a man from a pond at Muktapasi village under Kamakhyanagar police limits in Parjang block of Dhenkanal district. The deceased has been identified as Rajesh Kumar Pani alias Lulu, 43, of Saanda village in the district.

His family members have alleged that he was murdered and his body dumped in the pond. According to his family, Rajesh had told his wife that he was going to Muktapasi for a video shoot and left home Thursday. Before leaving, he recorded a short reel, which he later uploaded to his Instagram account. However, his mobile phone was found switched off Thursday afternoon.

Family members searched for him in Muktapasi Thursday evening but could not trace him. Meanwhile, locals spotted his body floating in

the pond Friday morning and informed the police.

While a motorbike and a pair of slippers were found on the pond embankment, Rajesh's camera was missing. His gold ring, necklace and mobile phone were also not found. Fire service personnel from Kamakhyanagar retrieved the body, which bore injury marks and showed signs of bleeding.

Police seized the body and sent it for post-mortem to the Kamakhyanagar hospital. A scientific team later collected samples from the spot.

Rajesh's brother-in-law, Arjit Kumar of Yernua village under the Saanda outpost, lodged a formal complaint alleging that someone misled Rajesh with a false story about a video shoot, murdered him in a pre-planned manner and threw the body into the pond.

Police have registered a case and launched an investigation.

'ACT NOW OR LOSE GROUND'

ZP member lambasts Odisha's Kotia laxity

Koraput, Nov 14: In a strong critique of administrative negligence, Zilla Parishad Member Tikai Gemel Friday demanded the immediate establishment of a permanent Revenue Inspector (RI) office in Kotia panchayat, warning that the continued delay is enabling the Andhra Pradesh government to intensify its activities inside Odisha's border territory.

Gemel said the absence of a dedicated RI office has created a serious administrative vacuum in Kotia.

"Because Odisha has not ensured a full complement of RI office in Kotia, the Andhra administration is taking advantage of the situation and strengthening its influence in multiple villages. This is not just negligence, it is weakening our border," she said.

She further expressed deep concern over the condition of the Pottangi teshil office, which still functions out of a building constructed during the British era. "The building is so dilapidated that important land records, documents, and files have been damaged due to water seepage. This is unacceptable for a border region office that handles sensitive and crucial land matters," Gemel noted.

The ZP member urged the district administration to take immediate, concrete steps not only to establish a permanent RI office in Kotia but also to demolish and reconstruct the existing teshil office to protect vital records and ensure efficient governance.

She warned that unless Odisha strengthens its presence in Kotia, the state will continue to lose ground in the long-standing border dispute with neighboring Andhra Pradesh.

"The government must act now. Delay is costing us territory, authority, and people's trust," she said.

Subarnapur ADT, PWCS sex held for bribery

Sonepur, Nov 14: Vigilance sleuths Friday arrested Subarnapur Assistant Director of Taxies (ADT) and in-charge Deputy Director of Handlooms Satyananda Behera, along with Primary Weavers' Co-operative

Society (PWCS) secretary Ramakanta Meher, for allegedly taking a bribe to release stipends meant for trainee weavers.

Vigilance officials said Behera had demanded ₹80,000 for the one-time release of stipends under the state government's Handloom Promotion Scheme. Meher was acting as an intermediary. A trap was laid at Nimma village, where Meher was chemically treated notes from trainees. He was arrested on the spot, and Behera was later detained in Subarnapur.

Following the arrests,

Vigilance teams searched Behera's office, residence, and ancestral house in Nayagarh. Three teams from the Subarnapur and Sambalpur units took part, and a case (25/25) was registered at the Sambalpur Vigilance police station. The investigation is under way.
